
EQUALLY SAFE IN COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES




STAFF TRAINING

GBV First Responder Training Programme

This is a two-tiered programme designed to equip college and university staff with the skills and confidence to respond effectively to disclosures of GBV. Institutions that invest in designated First Responders demonstrate a clear commitment to supporting survivors and fostering a safer, more supportive environment for students and staff.

STUDENT EDUCATION

GBV eLearning Module

The GBV e-Learning Module is a free, interactive learning tool designed to introduce students to key issues around GBV. The module covers:

- Facts and figures about GBV
- Consent and healthy relationships
- Impact of GBV and how to be a supportive friend
- Where to find support for those affected by GBV

Developed with input from key stakeholders across the GBV, further education (FE) and higher education (HE) sectors, the module is developed specifically for the Scottish context. It includes:

- A gendered analysis in line with 'Equally Safe' policy
- Information on Scotland-specific support for survivors and their supporters
- Relevant Scottish legislation and legal definitions
- Links to RCS's wider Equally Safe in Colleges and Universities (ESCU) project.

Peer Education Programme

Let's Talk about Sexual Violence is a peer education programme, designed in partnership with the University of Glasgow Students' Representative Union and Glasgow Caledonian University, for students with a keen interest in challenging sexual violence.

Peer educators complete a 3-day train-the-trainer course, equipping them to deliver 90 minute peer workshops for fellow students. The programme asks institutions to champion its values, advertise the training, recruit participants, and support students to coordinate workshops - amongst other requirements (see the <u>Let's Talk Brochure</u> 'Commitment' page for further details).
